However, the board should be assured that links will be made to this plan as the ACEs work-stream evolves to ensure consistency. • Attached is a draft action plan to be approved by executive prior to being presented to the June Board.

<p>What engagement has or will take place with people, partners and providers?</p>	<p>The action plan is based on recommendations from the JSNA which resulted from a robust JSNA process including stakeholder engagement. The action plan also includes updates on these recommendations since the JSNAs were published. Ongoing stakeholder engagement is required to discharge these action, especial actions owned by new and developing structures and organizations (for example Four Boards Chairs group and Children’s Trust)</p>
